The November 4 (Saturday) HAM training session will start at 9:00 am in the Mt. Pleasant North stake center. It will run for about four hours, and then we will offer the test.

## THINGS TO BRING:

- *A tablet or laptop computer* -- You can take the test on that rather than waiting for someone else's equipment to free up.

*Payment methods for fees* – The test fee is \$15. I believe you could pay that in either cash (no change) or check. The FCC (government) activation fee is \$35. That will probably be by credit card in the online application.
